

AUTUMN STATEMENT SHOWS TORY CHOICES IN COST OF LIVING CRISIS

So many constituents are contacting me about rising costs as inflation spirals. After the Tories crashed the economy in September, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and Chancellor Jeremy Hunt had a choice over who would pay the bill working people or oil companies and tax exiles. Well you can guess the choice they made putting up taxes for working people!

Of course even if they weren't part of the Truss-Kwarteng Government they have been deeply involved in the Tory years of failure - Sunak as a previous Chancellor of the Exchequer, Hunt as Health Secretary for so many years as the NHS was starved of funds.

They talk about difficult decisions, but they refused to put a proper windfall tax on excess energy profits or address the tax loopholes of non dom status. Everyday we see more and more examples of the NHS in crisis - millions on waiting lists, patients being treated ambulances because there are no beds for them, staff overworked and exhausted.

The Government are trying to blame it all on Putin and Covid, but other countries are not in the mess we are. It is their mismanagement over the last twelve years which has caused these problems.

The Government also refused to credibly address climate change in a way which creates jobs and meets our international obligations. Britain should be leading the way to tackle the climate crisis. Labour will lift the barriers to onshore wind and unleash our country's potential, cutting energy bills and creating quality jobs in the North East.

I called an Adjournment debate to highlight the lack of peer to peer support for birth parents in the adoption process and a wonderful, Newcastle based charity, Families in Care which, uniquely, provides that support to birth parents in Newcastle, and is increasingly in demand across the country.

I visited Newcastle's Cat and Dog Shelter and saw the fantastic work they are doing to care for pets abandoned or mistreated, especially during this cost of living crisis. They don't receive any national funding and are facing rising costs

I continue to engage with the Prime Minister, Ministers, Government Agencies and others regarding the local bus services, the ongoing situation in Iran, pandemic recovery in Africa, human rights in Saudi Arabia, and cuts to local BBC services.

SHADOW MINISTERIAL AND PES ROLE

After months of chaos the Conservatives finally identified a Science Minister and set out his responsibilities. George Freeman then announced half a billion of funding to address "Horizon uncertainty", without saying where the money would come from "or wether we would associate with Horizon"

With Shadow Secretary of State Jonny Reynolds I visited a number of great examples of science and innovation in Newcastle – Spincraft on the Scotswood Road, The Centre for Healthy Aging at the Helix, and Cancer Research at Newcastle University. We were both very impressed by the extent and variety of the research, development and commercialisation of innovation going on in Newcastle. We discussed the importance of a more consistent funding and regulatory environment.

I closed Labour's Opposition Day Debate on our Industrial Future highlighting how Conservative industrial policies have left working people poorer today than in 2010.

I continue to meet with stakeholders in the research, business and science communities to discuss how we can build an Innovation Nation.
