

CORONATION CELEBRATIONS AND CONTINUING COST OF CONSERVATIVE CRISIS

King Charles was crowned in Westminster Abbey at a ceremony which brought together world leaders and centuries of tradition. Across Newcastle many celebrated with Coronation Tea Parties or simply enjoyed a long bank holiday weekend with friends and family. I met the King and Queen at a Parliamentary Reception and invited them both to Newcastle.

The economic situation however continued to worsen for many. Inflation remains high and wages have not kept up. NHS waiting lists are at an all time high, causing real pain and suffering for many As I consequence more and more North East children are facing difficulties. I raised this at Prime Ministers Questions when I said to Oliver Dowden, the new Deputy Prime Minister:

Half the children in Newcastle upon Tyne Central are growing up in poverty. Over the last five years, the delivery of food parcels to northeast children has risen by 250%. The number of north-east children who are homeless rose by 50% last year, and on average their parents' wages have fallen by £1,000.

If any of this affects a child's mental health, they face a five-month wait for treatment. Why are his Government making it so hard for our kids?

In response the deputy Prime Minister praised the Government's track record! Britain has huge potential but we need an active Government to help realise it. Keir Starmer launched Labour's third mission, to build an NHS fit for the future, and set out details of how that will be achieved.

I spent a few days in Silicon Valley, speaking at a Biotech conference there, and then visiting leading examples of innovation including Google X and NASA. I also visited leading universities like Berkeley, Stanford and Santa Clara. I want to see an innovation ecosystem in the North East that helps create great jobs here.

Like just about everyone in the constituency, I am thrilled that Newcastle United will be playing in the Champions League next season.

BACKBENCH AND CONSTITUENCY ROLE

Surgeries continue to be very busy with housing a major issue for many constituents. Every week I see families desperate for a secure, affordable home. Access to benefits is also a major concern, and the lack of reliable, affordable bus services is regularly raised with me.

I visited the National Audi Office's Newcastle office and was very impressed with the work they do ensuring value for money in public spending. They also are focused on ensuring that they are an open, inclusive culture offering good jobs in our region.

I continue to engage with the Prime Minister, Ministers, Government Agencies and others regarding additional bus stops for new bus routes, the swing bridge, Sudan, social housing repairs, housing and homelessness, drugs and vagrancy, Horizon Europe, palliative care, and social mobility in engineering.

MEDIA

I have spoken to local and national media about a range of issues in the last month. On BBC Radio Newcastle I gave my verdict on the local Election results. I was interviewed by Manufacturing TV on the importance of innovation in manufacturing. My visit to America to talk at a conference on Synthetic Biology was reported by North East Bylines who noted the 'shout out' I gave to great local businesses. In Newcastle, I commented to the Chronicle on the worrying situation of far right extremists handing out food parcels with propaganda. The Chronicle also mentioned my PMQ (above).

I was also quoted in PinkNews on the government's poor response to my question on safe routes for LGBTQ+Ugandans. On a lighter note, my visit to Mrs T's Right Royal Tea Party was reported by Politico's Playbook!

SHADOW MINISTERIAL AND PES ROLE

I sat as a Shadow Minister on the Data Protection and Digital Information (2) bill. This bill attempts to modify the EU legislation on data protection GDPR to improve it whilst remaining compatible with European Union data flow requirements. It is not surprisingly a mishmash which fails to protect consumers or enable real competition. There are serious concerns that it could open the door to further abuse of individual's data. It is also not forward looking Artificial and barely takes account of Intelligence, for example. I spoke at the Foundation for Science and Technology in response to the Sir Paul Nurse Review of the UK's science and R&D landscape, offering Labour's vision for a high wage, high skill and high growth economy.

I continue to engage with stakeholders on Labour's science, innovation and research policy, visiting science driven startups here and in California's silicon valley.
