

A YEAR OF THE WAR IN UKRAINE

The first anniversary of the Putin's illegal war in Ukraine was a time to reflect on the horror and suffering the Ukrainian people have endured for twelve months, as well as their bravery and determination on the battlefield.President Zelensky gave an inspiring address to both Houses of Parliament "We have freedom, give us wings to protect it", Rishi Sunak and Keir Starmer travelled to Kyiv as well as US President Joe Biden. Support for Ukraine is unswerving across all parties in Parliament and also in Newcastle. I was pleased to join a vigil for Ukraine at Monument where Ukrainian Geordies expressed their determination to stand up to Putin's aggression. I also know that many constituents are hosting Ukrainians in their own homes or supporting them in other ways.

The other big political story was that the oven ready deal might finally be made ready.Rishi Sunak announced the Windsor Framework which would address some of the issues with the Northern Ireland Protocol.

In Parliament, I told him the Framework was to be welcomed as ending the uncertainty which has damaged communities, the economy and indeed our democracy. Sunak listed all the problems which the 'oven ready deal' his predecessor negotiated whilst not taking any responsibility for putting it in place, despite being in the Government at the time.

Everyone has been shocked and horrified by the pictures from Turkey and Syria following the earthquakes there. I have been moved by all the fundraising in Newcastle to support those affected and particularly the response of the members of the Turkish and Syrian communities in Newcastle.

The result of the Carabao Cup final was not what we wanted, but the fans and the team did us proud.

BACKBENCH AND CONSTITUENCY ROLE

Surgeries have been very busy with a wide range of concerns. Fear of rising energy prices is growing with the Government refusing to say what support will be in place after April.

I met with Liz Blackshaw of the Northern TUC to discuss the challenges facing working people, the lack of engagement from Government to resolve the ongoing pay disputes.

It was great to meet local 8 year old Newcastle United fan and fundraiser Wilfy, who has raised thousands of pounds for the Foodbank

I continue to engage with the Prime Minister, Ministers, Government Agencies and others regarding local bus services, the ongoing situation in Iran and Iranian regime supporters in the UK, cuts to local BBC services, the standard of living for NHS staff in Newcastle, and concerns from constituents about the Nigerian general elections.

MEDIA

I have been quoted and appeared in many local and national outlets on a variety of subjects in the last month. The Labour Party and I have consistently called for closer UK involvement with Horizon to benefit our research, I was quoted in The Express on this. My letter to the Mayor on the Strawberry Place development was picked up by many local news sites following the news that NUFC had bought back the land by St James' Park. I also highlighted in NE Bylines, the fact that Newcastle mortgages were rising as a result of Tory incompetence. Finally, the League Cup final was a great moment for Newcastle fans, I wrote a column on what the final meant to the City for The Mag, I also questioned LNER's decision to not put more trains on for the final on ITV, BBC, The Chronicle, The Mag.

SHADOW MINISTERIAL AND PES ROLE

I visited Cambridge and Newcastle Universities to see how they support and diffuse innovation and to discuss how better to engage with local businesses to support regional economic growth.

I led for Labour on a Statutory Instrument ensuring that Northern Ireland smart phones met EU standards on GPS, compatibility with Galileo being a minimum. I raised the UK's exclusion from Galileo which did not please Tory MP Michael Fabricant.

The Tories decided that, given all the challenges the UK was facing the best response was to reorganise departmental responsibilities. We now have a Department for Science, Innovation and Technology, in which my brief sits, and a separate department for Business and trade, as well as another new department for Energy and Net Zero. These reorganisations cost millions of pounds.

I continue to meet with stakeholders in the research, business and science communities to discuss how we can build an Innovation Nation.
