A YEAR AFTER THE TORIES CRASHED THE ECONOMY, THE NORTH IS STILL PAYING THE PRICE

In their Manchester conference, the Tories fight amongst themselves whilst people in Newcastle continue to pay the price of their disastrous mini-budget of almost exactly year ago. The resulting higher interest rates together with high inflation has led to over a million mortgage holders paying thousands more each year. And its impacted those renting too, as private landlords put up rents or sell their properties.

Month after month in my constituency case work I see that housing is the number one issue for people in Newcastle Central. Child homelessness is rising as is child poverty in the region – and we already have the highest rates in the country. Energy prices are still high. Our supply chains are weak. We're reliant on dictators for energy, but energy and water companies continue to make huge profits. Despite our vast potential, Britain faces low productivity, low wages and low growth.

But Rishi Sunak is too busy cancelling investment in the North like High Speed Rail and banning things that never were like seven recycling bins and compulsory car sharing, to deal with the problems people are facing.

Next week at Labour's conference we will see not short-term sticking plaster solutions, but a mission-driven government that will create a stronger national economy, and secure family finances. With everything we do built on the rock of fiscal responsibility.



BACKBENCH AND CONSTITUENCY ROLE

The failure of the Government to ensure a rescue deal for Wilko led to confirmation that the branch in Newcastle's city centre will close, devastating staff there and upsetting their many loyal customers – including me! I asked the Business and Trade Secretary whether this was what Tories meant by levelling up.

The felling of the beloved Sycamore Gap tree was an act of wanton vandalism which caused anger and bewilderment across the region.

On a more positive note I toured the low carbon district heating and cooling centre at the Helix in Newcastle, and helped open Newcastle Allotments show.

I continue to engage with the Prime Minister, Ministers, Government Agencies and others regarding Network Rail, Wilko, Hadrian's Wall, Iranian regime supporters in the UK, Tyne Bridge Repairs, Stephenson Works Anniversary, the state of the swing bridge and how we can make it swing again, moving visa applications from Sudan to Ethiopia, social housing repairs, homelessness, the UK Intellectual Property Office, tenancy turnover rates in Benwell, litter and bin collections, development of a 15 point litter plan for 2023, Horizon Europe, palliative care, and social mobility in engineering.
