

SUMMER IN THE CITY MEANS DIFFICULT TIMES FOR MANY IN NEWCASTLE CENTRAL

I hope everyone is getting the chance to enjoy some relaxation time with family and friends this summer – in sunshine or showers! But not everyone can afford to take time off, and the summer can put additional pressures on stretched budgets in this Tory extended cost of living crisis. Newcastle's Best Summer Ever can help with activities for the children and there are ideas for low cost activities on Newcastle City Council's website.

My constituency office remains open but Parliament has closed for the summer recess – on the very day of Labour's historic by-election win in Selby and Ainsty. I look forward to welcoming our newest Member of Parliament, Keir Mather, to the House of Commons in September.

I spent some time talking to people in Selby and Ainsty and it was clear that voters were turning away from the Tories after 13 years in Government - our economy is struggling, and working people are paying the price, whether through low wages, rising food prices or the interest rates on their mortgage payments. And rather than helping Britain tackle the twin cost-of-living and climate crises, Rishi Sunak is focused on issuing new licenses to expand our reliance on fossil fuels. While the Tories clash over net-zero, Labour's position on the issue is clear - it is our priority to make Britain a clean energy superpower, with 100% clean energy by 2030.

This is the best way to cut energy bills, create new jobs in the North East and deliver energy security for Britain.

Meanwhile, when it comes to science, the government has still not agreed participation in Horizon Europe, much to the dismay of the research and business communities. While Rishi Sunak dithers and delays, researchers and scientists, including those at small businesses like Newcastle-based TreatNMD, missing out on opportunities to bring investment and jobs to Britain. I believe that international collaboration is vital to advance science, and will continue to press the government on this issue. Labour is committed to association with Horizon Europe - scientific advancement will be key to securing the highest sustained growth in the G7, to building an NHS fit for the future and to making Britain a clean energy superpower.

Finally, I was really sad to learn that Wilko has entered administration - another consequence of 13 years of Conservative economic failure. I often shop at Wilko and I know this news will directly affect many constituents. I have written to

PricewaterhouseCoopers (PWC), the administrator for Wilko's, and will be writing to the Secretary of State for Business and Trade, to raise my concerns about the impact on employees, and on all of us who value a vibrant and varied city centre.

BACKBENCH AND CONSTITUENCY ROLE

When Parliament broke up, I was able to spend more time in Newcastle Central visiting local groups and organisations. I was particularly impressed by all the activities organised for young people across the constituency from circus skills to community gardening – I even got a chance to try out hula hooping! The level of casework continues to rise, with housing and immigration the top two issues among constituents for the last few months.

I brought different stakeholders together to launch my campaign to get the Swing Bridge swinging in time for its 150th anniversary including the National Trust, Port of Tyne, Tyne and Wear Building Preservation Trust, Derwent Valley Way, Gateshead Council, Newcastle City Council, Society of Antiquaries of Newcastle, Historic England, and Tyne and Wear Archives and Museums. I have been really pleased with the response including local, national and international engineering firms who are keen to help!

I continue to engage with the Prime Minister, Ministers, Government Agencies and others regarding additional bus stops for new bus routes, the state of the swing bridge and how we can make it swing again, moving visa applications from Sudan to Ethiopia, social housing repairs, homelessness, Stephenson Works Anniversary, the UK Intellectual Property Office, tenancy turnover rates in Benwell, litter and bin collections, development of a 15 point litter plan for 2023, Horizon Europe, palliative care, Hadrian's wall, and social mobility in engineering.

MEDIA

I have appeared in many publications on a variety of topics over the last month. I have lent my voice to the cross party calls for the full restoration of the Tyne Bridge to help our region's economy, this was reported across various North East council press pages. I have also spoken to the Chronicle about the state of disrepair in housing, specifically grade listed properties in Summerhill Grove which have been plagued with damp and mould.

I recently held a debate in Parliament about celebrating the 200th anniversary of the founding of Stephenson and Co. in Newcastle. My disagreements with the Minister were covered in the Journal and Chronicle – he kept telling me the wrong anniversaries! I also recorded an interview for BBC Look North on my campaign to make the swing bridge swing again.

SHADOW MINISTERIAL AND PES ROLE

There were rumours that a deal had been agreed for the UK to associate with Horizon Europe but these were denied as it became clear that the Prime Minister himself was preventing a deal being done. British science and science driven businesses are appalled by the damage inflicted on our science and research base and I have spent much time talking to stakeholders and reassuring them that the Labour party remains committed to association with Horizon.

We are also developing Labour science policies driven by Labours five key national missions: Securing the highest sustained growth in the G7, Making Britain a Green Energy superpower, Improving the NHS, Reforming the justice system, and Raising education standards.
